Topics: elements of phonetics and phonology, their place in linguistic framework; phoneme, phone, allophone; distinctive features, minimal pairs; vowels: monophthongs, diphthongs, triphthongs; consonants: voicing, place and manner of articulation. Phonemic and phonetic transcription; connected speech; prosodic features.
