This type of linguistic knowledge enhances theoretical morphological and linguistic thinking (structural linguistics), and also helps expand students' vocabulary. The focus of the course is laid on synchronic word formation processes. Topics: general concepts; defining word, lexeme, morpheme, morph, allomorph; root, stem, base, affix; monomorphemic and polimorphemic words; constituent analysis, labelled bracketing and trees; inflectional and derivational morphology; primary word-formation processes: derivation, compounding, conversion; secondary word-formation: clipping, blending, back formation, acronymy, eponymy, lexical import. Grading: attendance, participation, midterm test and final oral examination.
