<b>Description (max. 100 words)</b>	<p>Theoretical course revolving round the fundamental syntactic principles and concepts of the underlying theories of grammar. The primary theoretical framework is structuralist, but also transformational and generative. The focus of analysis is the structure of phrases, clauses and sentences examined through the basic syntactic relationships of predication, modification, complementation and coordination. Basic concepts of government and binding are introduced. Students are acquainted with principles of syntactic argumentation and syntactic tests. Sentence patterns and immediate constituent analysis serve as a starting point to establish principles and methods of analysis, search of exceptions and compare syntactic systems of languages – English and Serbian.</p>

They understand the relations of subject and object and their semantic roles. They are able to perform syntactic analysis.</p>
